Barely 3 weeks ago, we came together to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. On that Easter morning, I read from St. John's gospel, "Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the entrance. ² So she came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put him!" ³ So Peter and the other disciple started for the tomb. ⁴ Both were running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. ⁵ He bent over and looked in at the strips of linen lying there but did not go in. ⁶ Then Simon Peter came along behind him and went straight into the tomb. He saw the strips of linen lying there, ⁷ as well as the cloth that had been wrapped around Jesus' head. The cloth was still lying in its place, separate from the linen. ⁸ Finally the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and believed" (20:1–8).

Now, as we approach the midpoint of the Easter season, the question is, are our hearts still filled with joy and gratitude for the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ? On Resurrection Sunday, we celebrated God's great love for us and the hope of eternal life that He offers to all of humanity. But how has that fact and celebration impacted our lives?

I must confess, as I write this article, I'm sitting on the beach enjoying all that a beautiful day on the coast has to offer. I also must admit that if it weren't for writing this article, I would be thinking of a hundred different things. And the more I thought about it, the more I realized that this is indeed the challenge of the Easter season.

With Easter comes thoughts of summer, vacations, and the various other things that crowd our summer schedules. In May (5-6), we'll be busy with the Mission Region's convocation and with (May 20) our Flood Bucket build at Advent Lutheran, Kings Mountain. During June (11-16), we'll be busy with the Dallas area churches Vacation Bible School. In July (16-21), we'll be busy with the Mission District's Day camp and then in August (7-11), we'll turn our attention to the NALC convocation in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Before we know it, summer is gone, fall is here, and back to school time is upon us. Maybe this is one of the key reasons that Easter is 7 weeks long. The "week of weeks" give us ample opportunity to address the things that crowd our schedule and still give us time to ponder the love God has shown us in Jesus' resurrection. But there's one more thing we must consider in this Easter season.

Even as we rejoice in the Good News of the Resurrection, we must also remember that our duty as followers of Christ, is to be evangelizers; proclaimers of the Gospel message to all people and inviting them to share in the love and mercy of our Savior. When we look around us and take note of the hurt in our world today, we must understand the urgency of this work of evangelization. Through our proclamation and personal witness, we must take the opportunity to bring others to Christ and to help them experience the peace that comes from a life centered on Jesus in his Church. 


